<u>SUMMARY</u>: The primary responsibility and obligation of this position is to transport prisoners to and from the Garrett County Circuit Court and to provide courtroom security when in session. Provide security at the public entrance of the courthouse.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Responsible for transporting prisoners to and from Circuit Court and/or District Court in a safe and secure manner
- 2. Will maintain order within the Circuit Court during court sessions
- 3. When court is not in session, responsible for serving court process service
- 4. Performs other duties related to that of a Deputy Sheriff and as assigned

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Must be 21 years of age
- 2. Employee will maintain their law enforcement commission by attending a minimum of (18) hours of inservice training, per calendar year as mandated by the Maryland Police Training Commission.
- 3. Retired law enforcement officer, current law enforcement officer, or be willing to obtain a Maryland Special Police Officer training certificate. The training course consists of an 80-hour session.
